The effects of local accountability

With citizen report cards:

- Waiting time decreased
- Doctor and nurse absenteeism plummeted
- Clinics got cleaner; fewer drugs stolen
- 40-50% more children vaccinated
- 33% fewer under 5 children died




The mutual accountability problem




Problems of 'mutual accountability'
